

10 about 10 partnerships were established within the framework of educational initiatives


PROGRAM

YOUTH IS CHANGING UKRAINE – 10 YEARS OF THE PROGRAM

In 2023, the program celebrated 10 years of uniting young people around democratic values and the desire to change their country. Launched by the Bohdan Hawrylyshyn Charitable Foundation and extended by the Bohdan Hawrylyshyn Family Foundation, the program has brought together more than 1,500 proactive young people who are now the alumni community of the Foundation's programs.

For its 10th anniversary, the program underwent transformation – not only the name was changed but also the approaches to forming the educational component in accordance with today's challenges.

75 participants from all over Ukraine were selected for the program in 2023

The educational component included:

- program opening and networking with alumni of previous years
- meetings with experts in the fields of public administration, business, and the public sector
- learning value-based project management (based on Curly Management and design thinking methodologies)
- team and individual work on projects
- mentorship support from trainers and program alumni
- drafting project statutes and implementing initial stages
- grant support for the best projects
- online and live learning formats

Within the program, **7 winners** were selected, among whom 3 participants received grants of approximately 30,000 UAH each for the development of their projects. Additionally, 4 participants were given the opportunity to undertake a study trip to Switzerland in March 2024.

The winners' projects focus on strengthening communities, rebuilding, preserving memory, interaction between different target groups, media work to debunk fakes and hostile propaganda, and environmental protection.

MEETING OF THE FOUNDATION'S COMMUNITY

On August 5, the opening of the Youth is Changing Ukraine program took place, bringing together participants of the new intake, graduates, ambassadors, friends, and partners of the Foundation.

The program of the event included two panel discussions on the values that keep us together and the experiences that inspire us. The Foundation's team also presented the updated concept of the Youth is Changing Ukraine program, and the participants of last year's study trip abroad shared their experiences and highlights of the trip.

A special part of the event was a vocal improvisation led by singer, conductor, and improviser Valia Levchenko. In less than an hour, over 70 participants of the event were able to sing together and record the song "Zberemosya, Rode" ("Let's Gather, My People"). The uniqueness of this activity lies not only in the collective singing but also in the opportunity for participants to connect, feel unity, and experience inspiration as a result of the process. To commemorate the wonderful experience, a video was made of everyone singing together.

PROGRAM

UKRAINIAN YOUTH DELEGATE TO THE UN PROGRAM

In 2023, the program received 91 applications, which is twice as many as the previous intake.

Based on the results of the application evaluation, 24 candidates were longlisted and 10 were shortlisted. The final stage of the selection process was an interview of the top 10 finalists with an expert committee consisting of youth delegates from previous years and program partners – representatives of the Bohdan Hawrylyshyn Family Foundation, the Ministry of Youth and Sports of Ukraine, and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine. Kyrylo Demchenko and Mykola Popadiuk were elected as Ukrainian youth delegates to the UN 2023–2024.



In September, Ukrainian youth delegates took part in the 78th UN General Assembly, where they spent 3 weeks assisting the Permanent Mission of Ukraine to the UN, communicating with youth delegates from other countries, and representing Ukraine at events organized by student and international organizations.

On September 29, as part of their mandate, Ukrainian youth delegates addressed the Third Committee of the 78th UN General Assembly with an appeal to the world to remember that as long as the Russian war in Ukraine remains part of the present, it is extremely difficult to talk about a peaceful future.

It is difficult to think about the future while sitting in the trenches under fire. If we want to continue talking about the future, we must first show that the worst remnants of the past have no place in our present, – Kyrylo Demchenko.

Kyrylo Demchenko

is the Secretary of the Student Board of the National University of Kyiv-Mohyla Academy in 2020–2021. Co-founder and Chairman of the Executive Board of the Ukrainian Student League. Secretary of the Expert Council of Students of Higher Education Institutions. Serviceman of the Armed Forces of Ukraine.

Mykola Popadiuk

is a social studies teacher at Chernivtsi Lyceum #10 and the director of the ENGIN Program in Ukraine. Mykola is also a trainer, presenter, and project coordinator of online courses and programs, IFES civic education consultant, trainer of the Democratic School Program for Supporting Educational Reforms in Ukraine, digital education ambassador, and presenter of the Digital Skills for Teachers online course within Diia: Digital Education project.

We've heard a lot about the Sustainable Development Goals and climate change. But how can I talk about this to my students, considering the incredible pollution, landmines, bombs, and the destroyed Kakhovka Dam? Believe me, it's incredibly difficult to talk to children in bomb shelters when their loved ones are at war, – Mykola Popadiuk.

The delegates actively participated in youth events in Ukraine and internationally. On November 14–17, Mykola Popadiuk took part in the 13th UNESCO Youth Forum. On November 30, Kyrylo Demchenko visited Estonia with the support of the Embassy of Ukraine in Estonia.

MAIN PRINCIPLES OF YOUTH DIPLOMACY IN UKRAINE

The project on creating the Main Principles of Youth Diplomacy of Ukraine included three strategic sessions in June and August and the development of a report on the results of the meetings. The strategic sessions were attended by about 60 participants from Ukraine and abroad, as well as the working group that developed the document.

Representatives from more than 35 organizations from Ukraine, Moldova, Germany, Slovakia, Poland, Italy, Switzerland, the Netherlands, the United Kingdom, the UAE, Lebanon, Austria, Canada, the Czech Republic, and France participated in the strategic sessions.

In September, a report on the results of the development of the Main Principles of Youth Diplomacy of Ukraine was presented to representatives of the Department of Public Diplomacy and Communications of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine. Together with the members of the Youth Council at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, a text for a legal act on the Main Principles of Youth Diplomacy of Ukraine was developed.

YOUNG DIPLOMAT AWARD

The Foundation has become a key partner of the Young Diplomat Award, launched by the United Youth initiative. The team provided informational and mentoring support, and helped to organize and conduct the award ceremony. This is the first award in Ukraine to recognize the impact of young people on the development of diplomacy and international relations.



38 candidates applied for the award, out of which **15** made it to the shortlist.

The announcement of the award winner took place on December 22nd, on Diplomatic Workers' Day. The Bohdan Hawrylyshyn Family Foundation also awarded special recognition to the **6 best cases of youth diplomacy**.

TRAINING FOR CULTURAL MANAGERS IN LVIV

In May, together with the Lviv City Council, social change analyst and strategist, facilitator, and member of the International Association of Facilitators Dina Volynets, the Foundation organized an educational course on “Value-based Project Management” for the cultural sector of the Lviv City Territorial Community.

The training was successfully completed by teams from 11 cultural institutions in Lviv, including the Department of Culture, Nationalities and Religions of the Lviv Regional State Administration, the Maria Zankovetska National Theater, Hnat Khotkevych Palace, Ivan Franko National Literary and Memorial Museum, Lviv Municipal Library, Lviv Heritage Bureau, Lviv School of Arts 10, Voskresinnia Theater, Ya.vereta, Lviv Film Center, and Alternative Opera.

VALUE-BASED PROJECT MANAGEMENT COURSE WITH UCU-ONLINE

The course "Curly Management: How to manage projects through values" was developed in cooperation between the Foundation and Dina Volynets and the Ukrainian Catholic University's educational platform UCU-Online. The first wave of enrollment began in early June.

71 participants successfully completed the training during the first wave



Everything is changing rapidly in our country, so we need to adapt the tools we are used to working with. The course incorporates a combination of two methodologies – Curly Management and Design Thinking. This combination provides an understanding of how to build projects in line with our strategy, and how to anchor strategies to our values,

The funds raised for the training were donated by the UCU-Online platform to the #DemineToSaveLives initiative, with which the Bohdan Hawrylyshyn Family Foundation purchases and transfers demining equipment to Ukrainian deminers.



ANTS EUROPEAN STUDIES

In February-April, the National Interest Advocacy Network ANTS, in partnership with the Foundation, held a series of meetings for young people with prominent personalities in various fields. The space in which the events took place created a valuable and warm atmosphere. This is Bohdan Hawrylyshyn's office in Kyiv. This is the place where the prominent Ukrainian used to meet with young people, Ukrainian and world leaders.

European Studies became the basis of the course "Ukraine on the Road to the EU" by our partners. It is available on the Prometheus educational platform. Ukrainian and international intellectuals and public figures share their experience, including Andrius Kubilius, Rasa Jukneviene, Dmytro Shymkiv, Olha Trofimtseva, and others.

UKRAINIAN YOUTH FORUM: REBUILDING IN UNITY

On August 12, on the occasion of the International Youth Day, the Presidential Council on Youth Issues organized the Ukrainian Youth Forum in cooperation with more than 10 partners, including the Bohdan Hawrylyshyn Family Foundation.

The event was attended by over 100 participants from all over Ukraine, representing youth organizations and associations. The event was focused on discussions about European integration, reconstruction and opportunities for young people to actively participate in these processes in Ukraine and abroad. As part of the Forum, the Foundation presented an analytical report "Ukrainian Youth in the Focus of Sociology".

ANALYTICAL REPORT “UKRAINIAN YOUTH IN THE FOCUS OF SOCIOLOGY”


Young people are not only the future of the country. They are the present. Young people are already changing the country, and it is more important than ever to hear their opinions, feel their moods and understand their trends.

On the occasion of the International Youth Day, the Foundation, together with the Institute of Sociology of the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine, prepared an analytical report on youth based on the annual monitoring of the Ukrainian society.

Here are some of the findings:

- After February 24, 2022, young people began to realize the value of the state much more strongly. And although in 2023, general attitudes toward the state began to deteriorate (this is a general trend), there is still considerable optimism about the country's future.
- Civic identity became dominant among young people as early as 2005, and in 2022 it reached its equilibrium maximum (at least 75%).
- One of the indicators of improving living conditions of young people is the growth of their satisfaction with life in their locality. In this regard, they show the most positive assessments of all age groups.

- The highest scores are typical for young people when assessing justice in the state. In fact, the youngest respondents (18 to 24 years old) are the only group where positive assessments on this issue outweigh negative ones.

SCHOOL OF PHILOSOPHY FROM THE JUNIOR ACADEMY OF SCIENCES OF UKRAINE

On September 11-22, the Laboratory for the Development of Critical Thinking of the Junior Academy of Sciences of Ukraine held an annual school of philosophy dedicated to the figure of Bohdan Hawrylyshyn.

The event brought together **more than 100 students in grades 9-11 from all over Ukraine**. During the workshops, they learned about the life of Bohdan Hawrylyshyn, the history of the Declaration of Human Responsibilities, and how to join youth initiatives to be an effective part of their community.

III HAWRYLYSHYN READINGS AT WESTERN UKRAINIAN NATIONAL UNIVERSITY

In December, the Third Bohdan Hawrylyshyn International Scientific Readings were held at the Western Ukrainian National University (Ternopil). In 2023, the readings were dedicated to the 35th anniversary of the Bohdan Hawrylyshyn Institute of International Relations.

The event was joined by co-founder of the Bohdan Hawrylyshyn Family Foundation, Bohdan Hawrylyshyn's daughter Patricia Shmorhun Hawrylyshyn, and the Foundation's community manager Volodymyr Antkiv.

INTERNATIONAL FORUM FROM REINFORCEUA PROJECT

Since 2022, the Foundation has been providing information support to the ReinforceUA project, an educational initiative of MIM-Kyiv Business School.



The International Forum was a continuation of the ReinforceUA project brought together:

A BOOK FROM HOME: SUPPORT FOR UKRAINIANS IN LATVIA

Together with the Embassy of Ukraine in the Republic of Latvia and with the support of the International Renaissance Foundation, the Foundation launched the Book from Home project, which donated more than **900 books to local libraries and cultural centers in Latvia**. These are prose and poetry, as well as gift books about Ukraine.

The project features books by **16 Ukrainian publishers**: A-BA-BA-HA-LA-MA-HA, Old Lion Publishing House, Choven, Borodatyi Tamaryn, ARTBOOKS, Chorni Vivtsi, Crocus, Publishing House 21, My Book Shelf, Dukh i Litera, Portal, Ukraïner, Knygolove, Nash Format, Vivat, and Publisher Oleksandr Savchuk.

Today, there are more than 50,000 Ukrainian citizens in the Republic of Latvia, including about 15,000 children and teenagers who were forced to leave their homes because of the full-scale war. The Book from Home project was created to support Ukrainians in Latvia and emphasizes that the memory of our roots gives us the strength and inspiration to hold on and help our country from any place in the world.

THE SILENT FESTIVAL OF RESPONSIBILITY

As part of the Human Responsibility Day, the Foundation organized the Silent Festival of Responsibility. This is a traveling exhibition of illustrations created by Ukrainian artists Pictoric to the 15 points of Bohdan Hawrylyshyn's Declaration of Human Responsibilities.

The exhibition was opened on October 19 at the Ukrainian House in Kyiv. Thanks to the support of the Foundation's partners and ambassadors, the exhibition was opened in 5 more cities on that day – Lviv, Rivne, Poltava, Chernivtsi, and Mykolaiv.



Responsibility is awareness, it is constant self-improvement, because you are the one who changes the space around you,

RESPONSIBILITY AWARD 2023



In 2023, the award aimed to honor civil society organizations and their stories of responsible partnership, which, during full-scale war, strengthen Ukraine through their interaction and demonstrate responsibility at various levels.

The award was presented in the following categories: Responsible Partnership: Communities, National Partnership Project, Interaction Without Borders: Ukraine to the World.

The laureates of the award were honored with a prize of 100,000 UAH each, provided jointly by the Foundation and the International Renaissance Foundation, as well as with unique statuettes – symbols of unity and interaction. These statuettes were created in collaboration with the ZMIN Foundation and the sculptor Andrii Matviychuk.

In addition, Razom for Ukraine NGO awarded 7 shortlisted finalists with cash prizes.

#DEMINETOSAVELIVES INITIATIVE

The initiative was launched in 2022 as part of the Responsibility Award as a way to express gratitude to all Ukrainians for their daily actions for Ukraine's Victory! Within the initiative, the Foundation raised funds for demining Ukrainian territories.

In 2023, the initiative continued. In the spring, a large Vallon VMX10 unexploded ordnance detection frame was handed over to the sappers. In addition, colleagues from Geneva raised funds at the Culture of Care event, which were used to purchase another Garret RECON-PRO AML 750 mine detector.

In September, with funds transferred by the Foundation's ambassador in Germany, Oleksii Ivanov, and thanks to other donations from friends and alumni of the fund, 2 professional brushcutters-trimmers STIHL FS460K were purchased.

In total, equipment for sappers was purchased for a total of 645,296 UAH throughout 2023.




