THE YEAR OF AWARENESS AND ENGAGEMENT

For our team, 2024 was filled with various forms of interaction – in activities, communication with participants of our programs, partners’ teams, and joint development of new initiatives in Ukraine and abroad.

We continued to implement our traditional programs “Youth is Changing Ukraine”, “Ukrainian Youth Delegates to the UN”, “Responsibility Marathon”, “Responsibility Award”, and expanded certain areas of activity with new projects.

In September 2024, we launched the “Global Call for Human Responsibility Day” international initiative, which is based on spreading the idea of establishing a Human Responsibility Day at the international level. With this aim in mind, we organized a series of advocacy events and exhibitions in European cities such as Amsterdam, Zurich, Brussels, Warsaw, and Milan, and launched the Human Responsibility Day Ambassadors’ program.

We paid special attention to educational initiatives aimed at developing responsible leadership – among young people implementing projects in their towns and communities, and among young people pursuing international relations and ready to represent Ukraine’s voice on global platforms.

This report highlights the main focus areas of the Bohdan Hawrylyshyn Family Foundation’s work in 2024 and expresses our gratitude to the partners who help us meaningfully support and inspire changemakers in Ukraine.

PROGRAM

YOUTH IS CHANGING UKRAINE

This is a long-standing program of the Foundation, initiated by Bohdan Hawrylyshyn. The focus for 2024 was cooperation and team building.

The program in numbers:

- > 160 applications submitted
- 75 selected participants
- 3 days of online learning modules
- 4 days of offline training in Lviv
- 4 trainers from the Curly Management Bureau
- 6 experts from the Foundation's community were involved
- 58 participants successfully completed the training
- 6 teams selected as winners
- > 30 hours of mentoring sessions


We're convinced that the future of Ukraine depends on our ability to work together. Recovery and progress simply can't happen without the skills to cooperate and co-create. That's why this year, the Program is all about building those skills,

What makes the program special is that participants were grouped into random teams — with their individual values taken into account. In these new teams, they developed fresh ideas, practiced collaboration, and experienced the full cycle of project management: from handling grant funds to reporting on results, both programmatically and financially.

Key training components of the program:

- Value-based project management by the Curly Management Bureau trainers
- Boosting teamwork and collaboration skills
- Studying the specifics of human resource management
- Working with case studies tailored to today's challenges
- Mentorship support

Results

After the online modules and training in Lviv at the Ukrainian Catholic University, the teams began preparing project outlines and taking the first steps.

Based on the results of the final part, during which the teams submitted their projects for consideration, we selected the winners of the program. 5 teams received financial support to implement their ideas, and 1 team was recommended to participate in a study trip.

What problems do the winning projects solve?

"ShobSho" Board Game Project

The team aims to create and distribute a simulation-based board game that will help young people develop personal skills and gain knowledge in project management.

"The Civil Sector in 45 Minutes" Project

The project aims to encourage students' initiative and motivate them to take part in civil society initiatives following the lessons.

"United by Ecology" Project

The initiative aims to raise awareness among 100 ecological enterprises in Ukraine about waste management reform by developing an electronic guide that will include best practices, recommendations, and tools for effective enterprise waste management.

"The Walls Testify: From Rwanda to Ukraine" Project

The project team plans to hold a series of information and educational events to improve the understanding of Ukrainians and Rwandans about such tragic pages as the 1944 Tutsi genocide and the 1944 deportation of Crimean Tatars.

"Teaching Health Forward" Project

Within this initiative, the team aims to create a professional development and networking platform for active, motivated medical educators by engaging them in training sessions, internships, and both formal and informal communication, thereby fostering a strong community.

"History of the Canadian Ukrainian Diaspora" Online-Course

The project aims to create online lectures for Ukrainians aged 20-45+ from around the world, introducing them to the history, culture, and influence of the Ukrainian diaspora in Canada.

FOUNDATION'S COMMUNITY

Study Trip to Switzerland

In 2024, the process of forming a team for the trip took a new approach. Two more participants from the Foundation's community were selected to participate in the trip with the winners of the Youth is Changing Ukraine 2023 program. These were Ukraine's youth delegates to the UN for 2020–2021, Artur Aheiev and Dmytro Tomenko, who were unable to travel to the UN General Assembly during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The study trip to Switzerland took place in March and included over 10 intensive meetings with government and non-governmental organizations, as well as with the Ukrainian diaspora in Geneva, Bern, and Zurich. The trip also featured a dinner with the family of Bohdan Hawrylyshyn.

Each participant pursued research on their own thematic focus — culture and arts, tourism, banking, and education development. The study trip team shared more details in an interview:

Expert Involvement in Project Evaluation

A traditional way we engage with the community is by inviting alumni from previous years' programs to evaluate project proposals submitted by the current cohort of the "Youth is Changing Ukraine" program. The community provides expert support by assessing submitted projects and providing valuable feedback and recommendations to help our teams improve their ideas.

Local Meetings

Our community gatherings take place in various corners of Ukraine. The favorite messages in our group chats are photos from meetings at forums or conferences. Some of these events are independently organized by our alumni.

In April, a community meeting was held in Poltava. We shared the Foundation's plans and activities, launched the traveling exhibition dedicated to the Declaration of Human Responsibilities, and discussed ways to improve community interaction together with our alumni.

This meeting brought together participants of our programs from the Poltava region and Kharkiv. It's heartening to see alumni gathering at our events who value being part of the Foundation's 'family'. 


RESPONSIBILITY AWARD 2024

The annual award, established by the Foundation in 2021, recognizes civil society organizations for their activities based on the principles of Bohdan Hawrylyshyn's Declaration of Human Responsibilities.

Throughout 2023-2024, the award honors organizations and their stories of responsible partnership, realized through collaboration with representatives from other sectors — business, government authorities and local self-government, media, the defense sector, and more.

In 2024, the call for applications was announced on October 19, the National Human Responsibility Day, and the award ceremony traditionally took place on January 22, 2025, the Day of Unity of Ukraine.



We are inspired by how creatively and innovatively organizations build their partnerships, combining different tools to achieve results. This year, we see a shift in the themes of the submitted stories — with a clearer focus on memory preservation, cases related to anti-corruption projects, social entrepreneurship, and cultural heritage preservation. The stories are very diverse, each interesting and important in its own way,

DEVELOPING YOUTH DIPLOMACY

We began to develop the youth diplomacy direction in 2023 by holding thematic strategic sessions to understand and explore the needs, challenges, and activities of Ukrainian youth abroad.

In 2024, our activities established a separate direction of youth diplomacy, which brings together proactive young leaders who are interested in international relations and diplomacy. Key results:

Monthly workshops called "International Espresso" were launched — throughout the year, 6 meetings were held both online and offline, engaging over 300 participants.

A collection of stories "Best Cases of Youth Diplomacy 2024" was developed.

In synergy with the Youth Council at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, we continued to work on including youth diplomacy in the list of subtypes of public diplomacy.

Support was provided for the "Young Diplomat Award 2024" and other activities within the sphere of youth diplomacy.

10 YEARS OF THE PROGRAM IN UKRAINE

UKRAINIAN YOUTH DELEGATE TO THE UN

The Ukrainian Youth Delegate to the United Nations is an all-Ukrainian program aimed at enhancing youth participation in international diplomacy, promoting the principles of human responsibility in society, and implementing real global and local changes initiated by young leaders. 2024 was the 10th anniversary of the program.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine and the Ministry of Youth and Sports of Ukraine have been strategic partners of the program since its launch in 2014. The Foundation actively cooperates with the Permanent Mission of Ukraine to the United Nations in preparing for the delegates' international trips. "Razom for Ukraine", an American NGO also provides organizational support to the program.

As a result of the information campaign, **61 applications** were received for the program in 2024

10 candidates were selected for the final interview with the commission.

As part of their one-year mandate, youth delegates build connections with young people from other countries and organize joint activities and events at the national and international level.

We have an anniversary that speaks about the importance of the program, that speaks about the systematic interaction of partners, and the consistent work of Ukrainian youth delegates to the UN,

YOUNG DIPLOMAT AWARD 2024


The Young Diplomat Award is an initiative of the United Youth Academy that recognizes the contribution of Ukrainian young diplomats to the development of our country's international relations.

MENTORING MEETINGS WITH YOUNG PEOPLE

NATIONAL LESSON ON THE HUMAN RESPONSIBILITY DAY

In 2024, on the occasion of the National Day of Human Responsibility, the Bohdan Hawrylyshyn Family Foundation, together with Mykola Popadiuk, a teacher and Ukraine's youth delegate to the UN for 2023-2024, prepared methodological materials for the National Lesson on the Principles of Human Responsibilities.

From October 14 to 25, teachers in Ukraine and abroad had the opportunity to conduct sessions at their schools and discuss the principles of human responsibilities with their students.

140 More than 140 teachers in Ukraine and abroad joined the session.

TRAVELING EXHIBITION OF THE DECLARATION OF HUMAN RESPONSIBILITIES


In 2024, we continued to organize a traveling exhibition in cooperation with schools, universities, and cultural spaces in Ukraine and abroad.

In May, the exhibition was presented abroad for the first time in Portugal. In Lisbon, at the Ukrainian Heart Center, an exhibition opening was organized with elements of discussion of the principles of human responsibilities. Marianna Yeleiko and Anastasiia Shymchuk joined the event as representatives of the Foundation.

In October, the exhibition was held in Lviv as part of one of the largest cultural events, the Lviv Book Forum festival. The focal theme of the event was "The Power of Collaboration," which emphasizes the idea of cooperation between us as a driving force for change.

INTRODUCING THE LEGACY OF BOHDAN HAWRYLYSHYN

The legacy of Bohdan Hawrylyshyn tells the story of the development, realization, and preservation of one's own identity in extremely difficult times. The path of Bohdan Hawrylyshyn during the Second World War today is in many ways in tune with the challenges of thousands of Ukrainian citizens who were forced to move to other countries due to Russia's full-scale invasion.

In 2024, we continued to reveal the figure of the prominent Ukrainian to a wider audience, and Bohdan Hawrylyshyn's lifetime achievements were recognized at the national level.



BOHDAN HAWRYLYSHYN IS UKRAINE'S AMBASSADOR TO THE WORLD

At the end of December, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Ukraine presented the Honorary Ambassador of Ukraine award. This is the highest award in the field of public diplomacy.

ANNUAL CYCLE OF GIVING BOOKS “I REMAIN UKRAINIAN”

The initiative was called #code_of_responsibility and reached more than 300 participants.
